Recreation Coordinator Description Detail

The Recreation Coordinator will work with the camp administration to implement all camp games and activities within the guidelines with the camp administration for the best experience possible for camp and staff. The primary responsibility will be to implement and help prepare for all camp wide games, evening activities, free time activities, cabin time activities, dismiss from all activities. It will also be the rec coordinator's responsibility to be organized and to have supplies ready. It is also a responsibility to work with all of the campers and staff in such a way to allow Christian community to develop.

This position is accountable to Diane and Brian.

The Recreation Coordinator does not directly supervise any other staff.

The Recreation Coordinator shall perform all these duties related to the position as assigned by Diane or Brian, including (but not limited to):

1. To guard the hearts of all of the staff with no exceptions by seeking to find and emphasis everyone's strengths without drawing attention to their faults.
2. To serve as a mature Christian example for the campers and fellow staff.
3. To take responsibility for all activities at camp.
4. To think before acting and make wise decisions.
5. To participate 100% with encouragement and Christian sportsmanship in all activities.
6. To participate 100% in chapel and all small group and devotional activities.
7. To be on time to all activities.
8. To pay attention during staff meetings so individual instruction will be unnecessary.
9. To show attention and affection to all campers regardless of their actions.
10. To implement creative, traditional, and new activities each week that are age appropriate.
11. To be organized and prepare in advance. .
14. To keep track of all recreation equipment and notify camp office or any missing or damaged equipment promptly and to clean up after each activity making sure equipment is returned.
15. To clean your own cabin and participate fully in the cleaning of the rest of the camp while paying special attention to cleaning up after yourself and showing respect to the work of others.
16. To be willing to do any task assigned by camp management.
